You are encouraged to approach the Committee members or to send an email to the address below, if there are any issues or matters that you would like the League to consider regarding life on Dangar Island.

The next twelve months are shaping up to be a busy time for the League Committee with some significant work and issues in play. These include:

Roads: The poor state of repair of our roads has been raised with the Council. The Council have committed to conduct a trial using standard recycled road base on a 200 metre section of Riverview Avenue prior to Christmas. The aim is to get the mix right before repairing the rest of Riverview Avenue early in the New Year. Council has also been requested to roll the uneven sections on the roads on the lower sections of Dangar Island, particularly Grantham Crescent.

Peat Island & Mooney Mooney Development: Opposition to the State's plan to sell and develop Peat Island/Mooney Mooney land continues. The Island's submission, proposing that Peat Island and the adjacent land be used to create a Recreational Park and a Gateway Site to the Lower Hawkesbury and its Nature Reserves, is available on our community website

Draft Comprehensive Local Environment Plan (CLEP): *Christine Sanderson* and *Peter Wolfe* are coordinating our response to the proposed Hornsby Council Draft CLEP.

Water Access Sub Committee: The development of the Dangar Island Mooring Co-operative in order to

provide new boat mooring facilities at the main public wharf continues under the leadership of *Antony Schinckel* and *Ron Barelle*.

Other issues and programs: These include numerous activities in areas such as:

- chemical waste cleanup,
- improved parking in Brooklyn,
- clarifying Island emergency procedures, and liaison with Council on other matters that may concern residents.

DANGAR ISLAND RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

With long term weather forecasts predicting significantly hotter and drier conditions than in previous years, it is important that we are all prepared for this summer.

- Start with cleaning up your yard;
- Clean leaves from roof, gutters and down pipes
 - Clear piles of building materials, left over wood stacks and half-collapsed structures
 - Cut back any overhanging trees and shrubs, trimming to ensure that you break any continuous foliage link that your property has with the bush.

It is important to note that it is sticks with 6mm diameter (pencil size) or less that make up the 'fine fuel' we talk about. These must be removed to de-aerate the leaf litter, which will then pack down and protect against soil erosion.

When clearing your fine fuels and trimming don't forget "**Green Waste Friday**", every fortnight - the next pick-ups are scheduled for *2nd, 16th and 30th November 2012*. Contact

As the fire season is upon us you will require a permit from both the RFS and Council if you intend to light a fire in the open. Please contact our Permit Officer Bill Lynn-Robinson on 9985 7279 for all your permit needs. The permit system informs the authorities exactly when and where land owners intend to burn, and enables us to ensure appropriate measures are in place, so that fires remain under control. <http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/> has all the info.

Please be prepared this fire season and have your Bushfire Survival Plan completed. There is plenty of information available at <http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au> Remember, planning to make a plan is not a plan.

CO-OPERATIVE FAQ

If we have not answered your question below, send it to wharf@dangarislandleague.net and we will respond directly to you.

Q. Who can apply for membership?

A. Residents and Property owners of Dangar Island.

Q. How much will a membership cost?

A. At this point we can only estimate costs and we hope our original estimate of \$8,000 to \$10,000 per membership is correct.

Q. When will I be able to make formal application for membership?

A. We will call for applications when we have a final design and cost estimate and hope this will occur before Christmas 2012.

Q. When will we need to pay for membership?

A. After the first round of applications is received the Committee will call for deposits. Deposits are likely to be approximately 50% of the total cost. When the construction tenders are finalized the balance will be required.

Q. Can people share a berth?

A. Yes, there is provision within the Rules for a group of people to share a membership. The committee encourages the concept.

Q. How many Berths will there be?

A. This is a design issue that is partly beyond our control but we hope to have something between 30 and 38 berths.

Q. What size boat will the berth take?

A. The same as Brooklyn Co-op with the same rigging – 5.5 metres in length, 2.25m beam.

Q. Will berths be attached to a person or a property?

A. Berths will be attached to a person or a group of people. This is to ensure that all community members have a fair chance of accessing the facility rather than berths becoming an investment and remaining in closed circulation.

Q. What happens if there are more applicants than berths?

A. At the start of the Co-op, if we do not have enough berths, membership will be offered in an order established by published criteria set out on the application form.

Q. Will I own my berth?

A. Membership is membership of the Co-operative and is not the purchase of a berth. Membership will entitle you to use the berth allocated to you.

Q. Can I sell my membership?

A. Membership is by application to the Co-operative so therefore the Co-operative will administer

membership transfers. When a membership is cancelled the position will be offered to the next person on the waiting list for the current entry price. This money will be transferred to the previous membership holder.

Q. What if I want to cancel my membership and there is no one on the waiting list?

A. This will need to be assessed on a case-by-case basis. If possible the berth will be rented out until a buyer is available.

Q. Why will the co-op be responsible for the transfer of memberships and therefore berths?

A. This is an integral part of the structure of a co-operative – to be part of it you will need to be a member which means the co-operative administers these matters.

reliable than the current one. It also uses a different electrical charging system which should allow it to do a greater number of trips per day. The DIVMC thanks the community and Hornsby council for their ongoing support of this valuable service and recognises the ongoing efforts of the volunteer drivers, without whom, there would be no service. We ask the community to remember that the drivers are volunteers and should not have to disagree with passengers over the fare structure which is very well advertised. As part of the DIVMC responsibility, Council has asked us to remind all

vehicle users that they must hold a current driver's license and the vehicles must be registered, insured and displaying a current registration label. This includes the drivers of the ute and the owners of golf buggies. Other issues that come as part of DIVMC's remit from Council is that speed limits should be enforced (10Km/hour) and that anyone bringing a vehicle onto the island that will block the road for a period of time needs to inform DIVMC and neighbours before the event.


The response to the call for things to include has been wonderful! Almost 400 things have been submitted – from a speedboat for emergency use, to people willing to teach first aid and how to make a patchwork quilt. Offers have come in from as far as Marlow creek.

The process has relied on the hard work of more than 15 volunteers who helped compile the questionnaire, did face-to-face deliveries to more than 750 households, and are now helping with the design and printing.

It has been both challenging and rewarding reminding people that everyone has wonderful things to share, if they have the time, and that what we are creating is much more than a Yellow Pages for the region (i.e. the Directory extends beyond the sharing of professional services).

Irrespective of if you have contributed, we will hopefully have enough money raised from local sources to print a book for every household to be able to peruse the wonderful and very practical things on offer. We have opted for a physical book over a website because we want to make this really tangible. If it proves valuable to people, a web platform allowing for user-editing may well emerge.

Thanks to so many Dangar Island residents for their help in making living on the Hawkesbury even easier, more enjoyable and truly sustainable.


We are going to launch our own Dangaricious beer brewed to our specification at a microbrewery.



BUSHCARE - GREYBEARD V OLD MAN'S BEARD

Hanging high along Neotsfield Ave is an interesting epiphyte known as Spanish Moss (*Tillandsia usneoides*) which is increasingly associated with dead host trees. The plant belongs to the Bromeliad Family originating from South America.

It has soft grey slender curvy leaves, branching alternately, from thin stems that droop in pretty festoons over the host branches. *T. usneoides* has specialised trichomes for obtaining water and nutrients from the atmosphere, while providing protection from desiccation and still allowing photosynthesis.

As an epiphyte it shows no structures that indicate parasitic feeding from the host plant, however it competes with the host for light to photosynthesise which eventually weakens the host as it over-invests in new foliage to reach the sun. Studies have found *T. usneoides* thrives in association with particular lichens, so interactions with some combinations of epiphytes could be harmful to certain hosts.

We recommend caution in placing this introduced epiphyte in your garden as we've not seen local plants hardy enough to live in balance with it. Keep it off native trees and shrubs




SPANISH MOSS

even in your garden. Help us prevent it from spreading into Kiparra Reserve.

A native Dangar plant alternative that bushcare would like to promote for gardeners on the island is a beautiful grass known as Old Man's Beard (*Caustis flexulosa*). It has masses of pretty bright green curly branchlets with red brown sheath like leaf tips. It is an endemic sedge 60 – 120cm tall, common on sandstone, and grows on the southern slope of Kiparra Reserve.



Sources close to the Bowlo failed to return the Mullet Mail's Facebook.


